 This newsletter edition chronicles CAVIT activity conducted during second quarter. Teachers coordinated worksite tours and field trips for students to gain an understanding of their future jobs. Students created community service projects delivered to area agencies and schools. We are proud of the 318 students earning first semester honor roll along with 100% of our special needs students succeeding. We're excited for second semester!

Let's Hear about Careers

Held every November, the Career Speaker Forum activity pairs first year students in teams to secure a guest speaker to provide workplace information to their classroom peers. This project focuses on two goals: 1. Provide students with insight into the many opportunities that exist in their chosen career path and 2. Teach students how to apply professional skills when working with industry professionals. Students were taught how to contact a presenter, how to introduce the speaker, to lead questions, how to greet the person, and provide detailed instructions so the speaker feels welcomed during the entire event.

CAVIT saw 146 individuals come onto our campus to speak to students about the career they passionately represent. When surveyed, 99% of the 146 speakers provided a "Yes" response when asked if the experience was a good use of their time. Our students were complimented on their professionalism, enthusiasm, engagement, and terrific questions asked. Great job to all!

A total of 14 college and military representatives participated in CAVIT's CollegeCon event that provided students with current information on schools, degrees, FAFSA application, campus life, and searching for scholarships.



Students were able to select four workshops based on their interests and came ready with questions! A connection to students' dual enrollment earned at CAVIT and ways to leverage that credit was also shared.

A luncheon was held for staff and CollegeCon presenters to collaborate on shared needs and initiatives.

CAVIT is honored to receive the 2023 Golden Bell Student Achievement Award for our Medical Science Program provided by the ASBA (Arizona School Boards) Association. 
Teachers are excited to introduce themselves and showcase all aspects of their program during the January visitation event.
